INTERVENORS' RESPONSE TO THE REHABILITATOR'S <u>APPLICATION FOR RELIEF PURSUANT TO Pa.R.A.P. 123 AND 105(b)</u>

On November 15, 2012, Michael F. Consedine, Insurance Commissioner of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in his capacity as statutory rehabilitator ("Rehabilitator") of Penn Treaty Network America Insurance Company and American Network Insurance Company filed an application for relief requesting that the time for him to make objections to the transcripts pursuant to Pa.R.A.P. 1922(a) be extended by 21 days from the date of the order granting the application for relief.

In support of his application for relief, the Rehabilitator stated that the transcripts comprise more than 30 days of testimony over a nine-month period, and their extensiveness warrants a reasonable extension of the five-day review period. Appellees/Intervenors Eugene J. Woznicki and Penn Treaty American Corporation (the "Intervenors") agree and consent to the application for relief.
